Find your town on the list. Call and ask how a new refugee would register for ESOL, what the person would need to bring, costs (if any -- it should be free), how to get there by bus, and if children are allowed to accompany parents. Ask how many ESOL levels they have, and if students can start any time or if there are start dates.

Your local library is the best place to ask about ESOL resources. Gather resources onto a one-page handout that you can give to every client upon his/her arrival. It's crucial to have this document ready. Everyone will ask you: *Where can I learn English?* English is the key to finding a job, self-sufficiency, and feeling comfortable in America.
